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
#### **Blacktown Sister City Visit**

#### **Irrigation Trolley Project**

Quirindi High School was approached by Mr Peter Hird, a local farmer to build an Irrigation Trolley for his farm. Mr Hird was directed to Industrial Technology Metal teacher Mr Carl Harradine for suggestions. Two Year 11 Preliminary HSC Industrial Technology Metal students were asked to build the project as part of their individual project for Industrial Technology Metal. Build Requirements included supporting 7 metre Irrigation pipes and to be sturdy to cope with life on a farm. The project took two school terms to complete. Both students, William Roxborough and Robert Cameron, researched possible designs and steel sections to build the Irrigation Trolley from images from the Internet. Materials were sourced from a local Engineering steel supplier, Tamarang Engineering. William and Robert used metal working techniques such as: Packing wheel bearings, Mechanical Cutting, MIG welding processes and finishing techniques. The project was made from galvanised RHS and painted with an undercoat and finished with a two-pack John Deere paint to protect it from the elements. William and Robert gained a multitude of skills in all areas during constructing the Irrigation Trolley Project. Both students will use these skills when they create their Industrial Technology Major Projects in 2017.



# **Olympic Gold Medalist visits Quirindi High School**

With messages like 'Don't be afraid of change' and 'Give something a go!' our school's visit by Gemma Etheridge was very inspiring for our students. Gemma was chosen to represent Australia in Rio at the 2016 Olympics in the Rugby Sevens team.

Gemma was born in Tamworth and grew up in Coolah. After finishing school, she successfully attained a university degree in Science and became a radiologist. From there, she started playing Rugby at the age of twenty-five and played for four years.

Gemma herself will say that her life was pretty perfect at that stage as she was getting married and loved her chosen career. But just three months before getting picked to go to Rio she shattered her Anterior Crucial Ligament. This was devastating news to Gemma as the doctors said the ACL wouldn't heal for 9-12 months and she only had 3 months until she had to be ready for Rio. The doctors said her chances of recovery in that time period were very, very slim. Gemma said this was both mentally and physically challenging. She had to make the hard decision to quit her job and put her wedding



plans on hold. Through sheer determination and Gemma resilience. trained alone following strict diets and put all her focus on making it to Rio. Which she did.
